1.	<p>Here are a couple of questions before quoting the required fuel collapsible bladders to you.</p> <p>Can we have the Material Safety data Sheet of the fluid stored in the requested bladders ?</p> <p>Preferred fitting is an OPW connection has to be fitted at the end of each port. OPW being a brand</p>	<p>Please see attached MSDS</p> <p>The fitting is to be stainless steel CAMLOCK coupling</p>
2.	<p>We have some questions / comments regarding your specification:</p> <p>The spec calls for resistance to fuel distillates and crude oil, but also requests conformance with Mil-T-52983 and U.S. DOD ATPD 2266. Although tank materials that comply with Mil-T-52983 and U.S. DOD ATPD 2266 offer short term resistance to fuel distillates and crude oil, this material is not appropriate for longer term storage of these materials. If longer term storage is required , there are other bladder materials that are more appropriate.</p> <p>Which is more important, conformance to your listed spec(s), or compatibility with distillates and crude oil?</p>	<p>You can go with the MIL-PRF-32233 the latest military spec</p>

3.	Could you clarify if the tanks must be open top?	The tanks are closed

5.	If the tanks to have elbows hoses and valves we would prefer to send 4" with adaptors to 3" as it would be stock hardware for us.	OK
